Committee Vacancy - Social Coordinator



As ever we had a good turnout from both Juniors and Seniors for the Winter Dressage qualifiers with 3 Junior teams and 5 senior teams.

Juniors – there were 6 Junior Novice teams and our teams finished in 2nd, 5th and 6th. Well done to you all – all 3 teams ended up having to run just 3 riders in each which makes the results pretty impressive.

Novice Seniors – there were 26 Senior Novice teams and our teams came 6th, 9th, 19th, 24th & 25th – the scores were all extremely close with just a couple of points separating a large number of teams.

Intermediate Seniors – there were 21 Senior Intermediate teams and our teams came 16th and 20th.

There were some great results from the club with Phoebe Crawford coming 3rd in Jnr D10, Sarah Anderson coming 8th in D2 (and I mention this as she was riding my horse Toby – well there has to be some perks to being Editor). Sarah also qualified as an individual for Medium riding Lorenzo II.

Katherine and Sarah would like to thank all the volunteers that came along to help who stood around in the freezing cold all day. We cannot run these events without you.

Summer Dressage

Watch out for the email for team members for the Summer Dressage Qualifier which takes place on 3rd July at Potters Field, Earith. We are jointly hosting this with Cambridge Riding club so will be looking out for volunteers to help set up the arenas on Saturday 2nd July as well as helping with the event on 3rd and with clearing away after the event. Qualifying Classes are below – see full schedule for eligibility:-

Entries from teams or individuals. Three team members to ride Prelim 7 (2002), Prelim 12 (2005), Prelim 14 (2006), the fourth **Junior Dressage**

team member to ride Novice 24 (2010

Junior Elementary Entries from individuals only who will ride Elementary 43 (2006)

Junior Riding Test Entries from teams or individuals. All members of the team to ride the BRC Prelim Riding Test (2014).

Senior Prelim Dressage Entries from teams only. All members of the team to ride Prelim 14 (2006).

Entries from teams or individuals. Three members of the team to ride Novice 24 (2010), Novice 27 (2007) and Novice 28 (2008) **Senior Open Dressage**

respectively. The fourth member of the team to ride Elementary 43 (2006).

Senior Medium Dressage Entries from individuals only, riding Medium 69 (2005) OR Advanced Medium 91 (2016)

Entries from teams or individuals. Two members of the team to ride the BRC Prelim Riding Test (2014). Two members of the team **Senior Riding Test**

to ride BRC Novice Riding Test (2014),

Entries from pairs only, which may be made up of either two senior or two junior riders. Horses may have up to 124 BD total **Senior & Junior Pairs**

points. BRC Pairs 5 (2014) Points gained at prelim level will not be counted.

Don't forget we are running the Dressage to Music qualifier at Houghton Hall on 24th July. Get your music and floor plans ready to roll. We also have open dressage which we hope to see lots of members competing in too – there will be rosettes for the highest placed members. As ever we cannot run these events without your help so if you can help with arena stewarding, writing, scoring or score sheet collecting then that would be hugely appreciated.
